The European Green Deal calls for new means to build energy efficient and low carbon economies. Funded by the German Government's European Climate Initiative (EUKI), the ALLIES project offers precisely such means. It develops and implements the concept of Locally-rooted Financing Entities for Energy Efficiency (LFEEE), i.e. cooperative institutions to foster and finance energy efficiency measures in companies, private premises and municipalities.
